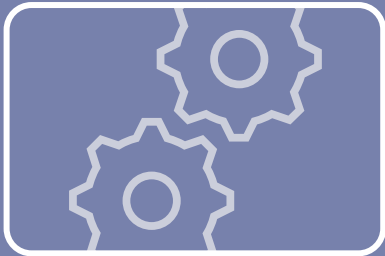

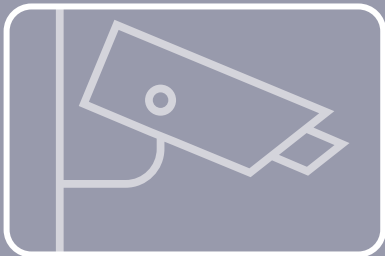
ILEAnet's approach

Recommendations for future activities to stimulate innovation uptake and research:

- ways to promote & improve the involvement of practitioners in security research
- ways to support the monitoring & uptake of security research projects' results
- Practical requirements for explaining innovation to LEAs



Rethink about the link between call/TRL/end user involvement	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Rethink about the link between call/TRL/end user involvement <ul style="list-style-type: none"> o "Redefine the way a TRL is assigned to a call" o "Do not necessarily engage LEAs in calls with a low TRL"
Assess the exploitation declaration of the projects that are submitted	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - "Launch a project only if the practitioners are committed and able to sustain the solution after the project ends (for projects with high TRL?)" - "Add an evaluation criterion based on exploitation for high-TRL projects (E.g., "at least one LEA use the project result at the end of the project")"
In-depth background check before launching a research project: look outside Europe, perform states of the art, have a look of completed and ongoing projects	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Avoid duplicating the efforts, leverage what is already existing <ul style="list-style-type: none"> o "Strengthen the exchanges between end-users inside and outside the EU" o "When a need for research is identified, perform a state-of-the-art analysis" - "Before engaging in a project, run a check in the past and existing EU projects (to have a vision of what has been done)"
